STATION X AUXILIARY APPROVED BY U. S.

The Federal Communications Commission has informed John Ames, executive secretary to the city manager, that it would give permission for the installation of an auxiliary police radio station in Cincinnati.

The auxiliary station, according to Mr. Ames, would cost \$12,000. He explained that other major cities possess auxiliary units for use in case the main broadcast equipment breaks down.

Mr. Ames said that communities near Cincinnati using the police radio station would be asked to contribute to the construction and maintenance of the auxiliary unit. If the plan is adopted. He said-that such a system was employed in other cities having two stations.
