## Covington to Build Own Radio Station

Cincinnati will be "glad" to transmit messages over Station X, the police radio, for 34 municipalities and subdivisions in Greater Cincinnati—at 20 cents a message. City Manager Sherrill informed officials of the subdivisions Wednesday.

He pointed out that City Council authorized the see in an ordinance passed Sept. 3 and which

becomes effective Oct. 3.

Since action was taken to charge for the broadcasts, three municipalities. Norwood, Wyoming and Covington, Ky., have taken steps to install two-way radio communication for their police departments. Norwood and Wyoming expect to have their radio systems operating within a few months. Definite announcement that Covington will have its own police broadcasting system was made Wednesday by City Manager Jack Maynard.
