Station X Calls Will Be Reduced

New System Set Up in Newport

A new system was inaugurated Wednesday over Newport's police call box system and use of Station X for police calls by Chief Leo Livingston to reduce the city's call fees through Station X to a very minimum.

Under the new Cincinnati regulation, which becomes effective Friday, Newport and all other cities outside of Cincinnati using Station X are required to pay

20 cents a call.

Chief Livingston has instructed craiser and beat patrolmen to make half-hour calls over the city's box system instead of the one-hour calls. Only calls of major importance will be made through the Cincinnati police radio station.

Under the new system, Chief Livingston said, he expects to reduce the Station X calls for New-port more than 50 per cent.

Meanwhile, northern Kentucky rities are proceeding with a plan to establish a police radio station, probably in Covington, to serve the local municipalities and Kenton and Campbell counties.
